Western Sydney's Flight Path:

Aviation Forum Charts Future of Tourism & Aviation

Campbelltown, NSW - 30 May 2025

The Western Sydney Tourism Taskforce (WSTTF) hosted a highly successful Aviation Forum at the Campbelltown Catholic Club, in collaboration with Wollondilly Business chamber and Liverpool chamber of commerce drawing a strong turnout from tourism stakeholders, government representatives, and aviation leaders. The event marked a pivotal moment in the lead-up to the 2026 opening of the Western Sydney International (WSI) Airport, spotlighting the immense opportunities for the region's visitor economy.

The forum aligned with the NSW Government's 2035 Visitor Economy Strategy, which calls for an additional 8.5 million airline seats to meet growing demand. WSI is expected to play a critical role in delivering this capacity.

The taskforce welcomed the officially appointed CEO Destination NSW Karen Jones.



Karen Jones reaffirmed DNSW's commitment to Western Sydney, encouraging local operators to engage with DNSW programs and leverage upcoming events to boost visibility.

David Donohoe confirmed that Qantas, Jetstar, and Qantas Freight will operate from WSI from day one, with plans to use the Qantas Loyalty program to tailor offerings to the Western Sydney market.

Simon Bernardi urged the region to develop a distinct tourism identity and prepare itineraries now to ensure seamless integration into global travel packages. Connectivity is key in public transport.

Gavin Harris announced that WSI has officially transitioned from construction to operational readiness, with the terminal now in the hands of the airport team.
